The MainePERS Board of Trustees approved most of the proposed rule changes to the PLD Plan at its meeting in May. Trustees at that time requested the System to conduct further outreach on the topic of retire-rehire for possible reconsideration at a later date. MainePERS held 11 informational meetings across the state in June on the proposed changes to retire-rehire. Most of the meetings were well attended. The interaction in those meetings was useful to MainePERS, and we believe was also useful to the participants.

We are now submitting a modified proposed rule change on retire-rehire to the Board of Trustees and are notifying you of the public hearing that will be held as part of that process.
